Arts Organization of the Year

Recognizes an arts/cultural organization that demonstrates exemplary achievement in fulfilling its mission, community impact and managerial strength. Organizations must be located in Greater Metropolitan Phoenix area and have tax-exempt 501(c)(3) status. (click here for application)

Arts Advocate of the Year

Recognizes a business, civic, community or arts leader who has demonstrated exemplary leadership and support of the arts/cultural community, significantly impacting one or more arts organizations, or the arts community in general. (click here for application)
